- 1.) I believe by the time you are reading our August KofC State News Magazine, the State Secretary and I will be mid-way through the 141st Supreme Convention which is being held in Orlando, FL this Fraternal Year. As of now, I'm busy preparing for the Convention week and was informed I will be on two committees as part of the Convention. Our Vermont delegation includes myself and my wife, Rose, our State Secretary Chris Poirier, and his wife Linda. We have our VERMONT themed moose hats ready for the States's Dinner and hope to do VT proud! (Maybe not with our rendition of our state song *These Green Mountains*, though) The Supreme Convention is 7/31st through 8/3rd.
- 2.) We held our Summer District Deputy Organization meeting at St. John Vianney Church on Saturday 7/22. It was very well attended by our DD's, District Master, Field Agent, State Officers, Membership Dir, and multiple Grand Knights (as invited by their DD) as well as our Regional Growth Director Bill Chasse.
- The agenda included reviews of best practices for Membership Growth, On-Line/On-Demand training for Council Officers, Fraternal Benefits, Programming and General District Needs and Feedback. We also discussed several new Supreme initiatives such as the new COR Initiative. Thanks to our State Chaplain Fr. Tim, we also had a Eucharistic Adoration Hour prior to the Meeting.
- Copies of all the material presented and discussed were compiled and sent (email) by our State Secretary Chris to all participants. Please let your DD know if you would like a copy of the material. It is very worth your time to glance through and review.
- 3.) One of the items we discussed during our DD Org meeting is the COR initiative. I am anxiously looking for a COR representative for Vermont this new position is called the State Evangelization and Faith Formation (EFF) Director. The position works directly with the State Deputy, State Chaplain, State Faith Formation Chair and DD/GKs, and his team. Because of the importance of this position, Supreme will provide 2-day training in NEW HAVEN, CN at KOFC Supreme Headquarters. Here are some details provided:
- The State Evangelization and Faith Formation (EFF) Director, appointed by his State Deputy, is meant to be a year-over-year position dedicated to implementing, advancing, and integrating the evangelization and faith formation initiatives of the Supreme and State Councils respectively.
- Reports directly to the State Deputy.
- Promotes and communicates the directives, opportunities, and goals of the Supreme Council and the State Deputy concerning evangelization and faith formation.

- Supports the State Deputy through collaboration with other State Directors to integrate Cor and additional EFF initiatives into state council initiatives and strategic planning.
- Prepares and sends needed communication to advance and support EFF initiatives.
- Consults with and informs the State Chaplain on EFF initiatives (State Deputy involved).
- Manages and coordinates the State Evangelization and Faith Formation Team.
- Collaborates directly with local Agency representatives, particularly those on the EFF Team.
- Provides direction, coaching and support to District Deputies (DDs) as they advance these initiatives for their local councils.
- Provides direction, coaching and support to Grand Knights and Council Evangelization and Faith Formation Directors

Please let me know of any questions. I hope to identify a Knight within a few weeks.

I will continue to do this until we're sure any VT Knight impacted from the flood has been identified. We're also working with the VT Catholic Charities to see if there is an opportunity to help. State Chaplain Fr. Tim has also reached out to his fellow Priests and Chaplains.

The net of this is. Please communicate with your D District Deputy if you need assistance or if your council is helping a family and needs additional help (physical) from other Knights or Financial.

Our Hearts and Prayers continue to go out to Winooski Council 2284 Knight David Hartnett and his wife Lisa. Dave and Lisa lost their beloved daughter Katy a few weeks ago due to the flooding. Many of us knew Katy from when she was a little girl playing soccer or young woman playing softball and involved in many community activities to an outstanding young educator in the Burlington School District. Her loss is heavy on our community.

6.) State Membership Director Ed Nuttall Council visits. I've said it before and I will say it again, Vermont has one of the best Membership Directors in the Order. SMD Ed provides weekly, monthly and as needed, detailed analysis on every angle of Membership Growth and has compiled much data and experiences on Membership growth best practices. 





While it is preferred that the ceremony be performed live, it is acceptable to have candidates participate in the ceremony using the pre-recorded video.

There are many ways to add new members; The On-Demand ceremony can be accessed by candidates online 24 hours a day. But before inviting a candidate to participate in the On-Demand ceremony, make sure your council has completed their standard admissions process and has collected the information needed for his form 100. Councils must file a Form 100 for all candidates who complete an online exemplification.

Simply by being active, committed Knight of Columbus families doing our best to practice Christ's commandments to serve our fellowman, especially those less fortunate, and standing together in Christian witness, we are spreading the Good News of the Gospel: we are evangelists.

With the Grace of God let us all work to build the Knights of Columbus of the Future.



News from Council 399 - Central VT




The carpeting had to be removed and the bottom of the walls were taken out due to mold.

The Future of Our Church

Keep the faith alive by supporting our seminarians and postulants. As the strong right arm of the church, the Knights of Columbus are committed to providing moral, financial and spiritual support to future priests and religious at all stages of their formation.

The future of our church is directly tied to people answering God's call to a religious vocation. The RSVP (Refund Support Vocations Program) has been and is the primary program through which Knights of Columbus councils, and assemblies participate in an organized manner in supporting vocations to the priesthood and religious life. The Church, especially here in Vermont as we all know faces a crisis of vocations to the priesthood and religious life. As Knights we need to intensify our vocational promotion. Promoting vocations to the priesthood and religious life is one of our highest priorities of the Knights of Columbus.

The Knights of Columbus stand in solidarity with our priests and religious. Through this program, council and parish families will raise funds to support seminarians in their area. For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported. Though financial support is vitally important, it is not the only aspect of RSVP. Councils are also called to provide their "adopted" seminarian or religious aspirant with moral support and prayers for their success.

Our Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP) Scholarship money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, clerical clothing, emergency expenditures and other living expenses.




