As usual, I will provide my thoughts, requests and information in a list form... it is a personality trait I suppose, and it keeps me organized....

1.) The VT KofC Installation of our State Officers and District Deputies was held in conjunction with our KofC Pilgrimage to St. Anne's Shrine on Sunday 8/27. We had numerous Knights, wives and families' members participate in both the installation and the picnic that followed. It was awesome to see and speak with Knights and family members from across the State. I received several great ideas for events and hope to see them happen... thanks Nelson and Andrew for your ideas, to name a few! I do like to thank District Deputy Mike Patnode and his wonderful District 1 members for sponsoring and hosting the picnic! A loud shout out to our State Chaplain Fr. Tim Naples for celebrating the Mass, Chris Poirier and 'band' for the music, District Master Dave Ely Sr. for the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree (and of course the 4<sup>th</sup> Degree Knights who as usual made our event that much more special), the Ushers – Paul De La Bruere and Team, PSD Jerry Bean, SW Bill LaCroix, Deacon Armand Auclair (from S. BTV), Altar Servers Ben Michael and Carlos Garibay, Bearer of Gifts DD Michael and Carlo Patnode! Besides our SS Chris Poirier, our choir included DD Joe Kelly, Michelle LaCroix, State Treasurer Peter and Karen Fitzgerald and State Advocate Elijah and Megan LaChance. I hope I did not miss anyone!

2.) I am happy to announce that GK Michael Bullock from council 7525 in South Burlington has agreed to serve as our State Evangelization and Faith Formation (EFF) Director. He has received training on the new Supreme program called COR, this past weekend in New Haven, CN. I have asked each DD to nominate at least one person from their district to serve on Mike's committee. I'm happy to be included on this committee along with our FA David Giuliani and SC Fr. Tim Naples... EFF Director Michael is looking forward to see his committee increase in numbers and I'm happy to help with that. Remember, the COR program is essentially a Men's Spiritual Group that we hope many of our Parishes will have. The COR program will help start a Men's 'fellowship' or offer resources if needed or asked for, to existing groups.

3.) Flood Relief. Our VT KofC Disaster Relief team has been working with Supreme to obtain some funds to help support those Knights, Widows, Families and Parishioners who have been impacted by the flood. Our committee will meet over the next few weeks to document, evaluate and establish criteria for disbursement of these funds and gift cards. More to come on this. The hosting council, Burlington #279 has made every effort to keep the ticket costs to a minimum (\$60). Please reserve your tickets online. They will be logged in the order received.



# **Raising Awareness About Life Insurance**

Each September since 2003 has been designated as Life Insurance Awareness Month. Like most awareness-raising campaigns, Life Insurance Awareness Month was created because there is an overwhelming lack of understanding of life insurance, its uses, its benefits, and its variations among the general public. Each year, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) puts out the results from a recent survey, and unfortunately, the numbers they report continue to be discouraging.

A recent survey found that a majority of those surveyed were uncomfortable with the economy and the uncertainty it brings, yet they did not seek professional assistance. Maybe they spoke with their friends and family. Maybe they hoped the instability would go away on its own. Maybe they did not know where to turn.

Please remember that as a member of the Knights of Columbus, possibly the greatest benefit you have is a full-time, professional agent you can call your own. My primary responsibility is the care and service of your family's life insurance, retirement and long-term care needs. I'll answer your questions because I want your decisions to be informed ones.

Another LIMRA statistic said 43 percent of people did not buy life insurance because they worry about "making the wrong decision." Regardless of what decisions may be made, doing nothing at all or putting it off is a certain risk. I hope to speak with all of you soon about ways to protect your family's future.

As part of the Order's ongoing support of Special Olympics, each jurisdiction in the United States and Canada receives a check to present to the Special Olympics organization in its state, province, or territory every year. I know that most of you are finishing up your Tootsie Roll Drive. When you send in your money, please consider the Special Olympics. Please do so soon.

The check amount is based on council participation in Special Olympics programming in your jurisdiction compared to other jurisdictions within your membership division. To earn a larger check for your state deputy to present to Special Olympics, encourage councils to report their participation in Special Olympics programs through the online <u>Fraternal Programs Report Form</u> (#10784).

All participation taking place in calendar year 2023 must be reported through the online #10784 by January 31, 2024, to be considered in the rankings. Rankings will be determined, and checks will be issued, by April 2024. Rankings are based on categories such as number of volunteers, volunteer hours, and donations.




# THINKING OUTSIDE THE BOX





The Knights of Columbus recently marked the birth (Aug. 12), feast (Aug. 13) and death (Aug. 14) of the Order's founder, Blessed Michael McGivney. Earlier this month, a relic of Father McGivney made its way to Portugal, traveling with a group of college Knights participating in World Youth Day. The Knights had the opportunity to share his story — and relic — with pilgrims from around the world. Closer to home, Father Jim Sullivan, rector of the Basilica of the Immaculate Conception in Waterbury, Connecticut, fosters devotion to Blessed Michael in the priest's hometown and home parish.
