Many of us have come to know Archbishop Coyne personally and he will be missed. I think it is very exciting that his new appointment is at the hub of the Knights of Columbus Order in New Haven, Hartford, and Litchfield areas. Hopefully, our VT Knights of Columbus have provided him with inspiration and appreciation for the great works of charity and fellowship that our Order provides, and he will simply hit the ground running from a KofC engagement perspective! I also hope that our councils continue to allocate funds to support our State-wide KofC VCCF (Donor Advisory Fund) which Archbishop Coyne encouraged us to start and fund which focuses on those needs and charities that are more state-wide impacting and not just local communities e.g., Totus Tuus

Here are my reflections from the month of September:

- 1. Happy 125th Council Anniversary for St. Albans Council 297. It was a privilege to be present and attend St. Albans's 125th Anniversary Banquet. They did an amazing job with the event including showcasing the great history of the council, highlighting all the Grand Knights from the past 125 years, and presenting the many awards and honors the council has received! Excellent turn out for the event. Congratulations!
- 2. Regional Growth Director Bill Chasse's Vermont visit. This was held in early September. Our RGD Bill visited 3 locations... Rutland, Newport and Morrisville and presented both information and Q & A on any KofC related topics. While I had hoped attendance would be a little higher, we all got a lot out of the sessions and will bring back the information to our councils. RGD Bill plans to visit again late winter/early spring and we will do our best to better plan and communicate the events. It was a bit rushed this past time, but we made it happen nonetheless! He'll target other areas of the State.
- 3. COR. Our Evangelize and Faith Formation Chair GK Michael Bullock provided a COR update during our Sept. State Council Meeting on 9/28. The State Council is very excited about this Supreme Initiated program and expects VT to have a high percentage of Councils participating in one form or another. Please email GK Michael Bullock if you have any questions. We have a representative from each district and will begin to provide more information.
- 4. VT KofC Flood Relief Committee: I met with our Disaster Recovery Chair Chirs Poirier and established a criterion for how we will disperse the funds we have received from Supreme for the summer flood victims. Many thanks also go out to our Field Agent Dave Giuliani and State Chaplain Fr. Tim Naples for their support and involvement. We ended the current flood relief support as of 9/15/23 but let either me or WSS Chris know of any additional flood victims needing support. Funds are very limited at this point but have been avail for Knights/families, widows, Catholics, and Non-Catholics.
- 5. Membership Growth in the VT KofC Jurisdiction. I don't want to add any spoilers to our WMD Ed Nuttall's update and will continue to ask that councils 1. Communicate their events and projects in the church bulletins, 2. Meet regularly with your parish Priest or Chaplain to inquire about new members. 3. With the Priest's permission, place copies of Supreme's 'Why Join' in the Church so that families and prospective Knights may bring home a copy.

6. KCIC – Keep Christ in Christmas Campaign is right around the corner. Our KCIC Chair is Jeff Fortier.


Each GK and FS has a softcopy of our State Directory to look up contact information for State chairs, Officers, and DD's.

- District Deputy Mid-Year Organization Meeting 12/9 at St. John Vianney Church (basement section).



As such, just as was done this year, resolutions will NOT be accepted from the floor of the 126th Annual State Convention next year.

The resolution submitted to the Resolutions Committee need not be in official format; the Resolutions Committee will assist you with formatting, but you MUST get notice to the Resolutions Committee of your intention to submit a resolution on a particular topic by JANUARY 15th, 2024.

As a reminder, Resolutions are accepted on areas of importance to the State Council, the State of Vermont, the United States of America, or the world, but they must reflect the values of the Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus and must not propose a change in Church doctrine. All resolutions will be screened by the Resolutions Committee.

Resolutions for 125th Vermont State Convention 2023 (Reprinted as Examples of Successful Resolutions)

A Resolution Honoring Pope Francis, Our Bishop, & Supreme Council

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Knights of Columbus of the State of Vermont assembled in the 125th Annual Convention offer:

- A. To our most beloved and esteemed Sovereign Pontiff Pope Francis, our sincere best wishes for good health and long, fruitful spiritual leadership, with the assurance of our continued loyalty to the Holy Mother Church.
- B. To His Excellency, the Most Reverend Christopher Coyne, Bishop of Burlington, our pledge of love, support, and continued prayers for good health.
- C. To our Supreme Knight, Patrick Kelly, Supreme Chaplain, Supreme Council Officers and Supreme Board of Directors, our prayers that Almighty God will continue to grant them good health, wisdom, and inspiration for continued leadership for our Order.

Honoring the Service of Pope Benedict XVI

WHEREAS Pope Benedict XVI served our Holy Catholic Church with pastoral leadership, and

WHEREAS he passed into the arms of his Loving Father on December 31, 2022,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the that the Knights of Columbus of the State of Vermont assembled in the 125th Annual Convention offer:

- A. Our prayers for the repose of his eternal soul; and
- B. Our sincere thanks and deepest respect for his service to God and to the Church.

A Resolution Regarding an Increase in State Per Capita

WHEREAS the current annual State Per Capita rate is \$7.25/active member and was last changed in 2016, and

WHEREAS, if adjusted for inflation, according to the CPI Inflation Calculator at the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics that figure would be \$9.11/member today, and

WHEREAS the Vermont State Council has incurred increased expenses due to inflation while carrying out its roles in supporting the local Councils, and has recently undertaken to pay for liability insurance for all Councils and members in Vermont, an expense formerly borne by the local Councils.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that, beginning in the 2023-2024 Fraternal Year, the State Per Capita rate shall be \$8.50/member, and

FURTHER RESOLVED that all appropriate State Policies will be updated to reflect this change.

A Resolution Regarding the Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities

WHEREAS the Vermont Knights of Columbus Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities, informally the "Tootsie Roll Program," was instituted to help councils raise money for charities that support individuals with intellectual disabilities, and

WHEREAS all councils are highly encouraged to enthusiastically promote and collect donations for the Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities to the best of their ability, during weekend drives between June 1st and October 31st, and

WHEREAS councils that participate in the annual Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities provide the Vermont State Council at least twenty percent (20%) of their total proceeds (plus expenses such as Tootsie Rolls, aprons, etc.) to support Camp O'Hagan,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that beginning in the 2023-2024 Fraternal Year, councils will provide the Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities Chairman a full accounting of their collection drive date(s), all collection proceeds, supply orders, and the names of and specific donations to council-selected charities that serve people with intellectual disabilities, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that councils will, based on their accounting, calculate 20% of their proceeds and their expenses and will, instead of providing their full proceeds and receiving 80% back as was previously done, will submit only their accounting specified above and their check for at least 20% of proceeds before expenses, made out to the "Vermont State Council," directly to the campaign Chairman, with the check to be deposited directly in the Vermont State Council's Camp O'Hagan Fund.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Vermont State Council and all local Councils shall remain, today and always, as loyal to the Catholic Church and to the Order and principles of the Knights of Columbus as they have been over the past 125 years.



FROM THE DESK OF THE VT STATE MEMBERSHIP DIRECTOR

- When a council receives notification from the VT SMD that a new member has signed on but hasn't selected a council to join, the member is notified he is assigned to council near his home/church. He is further notified that the Grand Knight and/or District Deputy will be in contact with him. Member is also notified an exemplification of the degree is required for which the GK and DD are required to schedule. Upon completion of the requirement, FS, using member management, notifies Supreme, who then assigns member to that Council.
- If the member elects to join a council at the time of enrolment with KofC.org/Join Us, the VT SMD is notified along with the GK, who must schedule the exemplification. When completed, the FS, using member management, notifies Supreme of completion and assigns member to that Council.
- Using brochure "Why Join? #06510-3326, councils should distribute during Mass in an upcoming Delta Drive. The brochure speaks for itself. By personally handing these to possible candidates and encouraging one to join by contacting KofC.org/Join Us, begins the recruiting process. But remember, follow-up is required. A phone call, a text message, an email is required to ensure success.

VOCATIONS THE FUTURE OF OUR CHURCH

. As the strong right arm of the church, the Knights of Columbus are committed to providing moral, financial, and spiritual support to future priests and religious at all stages of their formation. The future of our church is directly tied to people answering God's call to a religious vocation. Promoting vocations to priesthood and religious life is one of the highest priorities of the Knights of Columbus.

The RSVP (Refund Support Vocations Program) has been and is the primary program through which Knights of Columbus councils, and assemblies participate in an organized manner in supporting vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Councils are required to provide financial support of at least \$500 for a minimum of one seminarian. Councils are also required to provide their "adopted" seminarian or religious aspirant with moral support and prayers for their success. This is a central aspect of RSVP and must be fulfilled to satisfy the program requirements.

. For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported.

Our Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP) Scholarship money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, clerical clothing, emergency expenditures and other living expenses.

I ask that all our councils work with me as your State Vocations Director to ensure the proper and complete implementation of the RSVP program to ensure that every seminarian sponsored by the diocese is included in the RSVP program.






