

### **Procedures for Merging Two or More Councils**

Under the Order's guidelines, the merging councils must complete the following steps independently in order to merge:

- Draft a resolution calling for the Merger.
- 2. Read the resolution at one (1) meeting.
- Publish the resolution to each of the council's members.
- 4. Vote on, and approve, the resolution at the following meeting.
- Once the councils approve the merger the District Deputy will then write a request for the merger and sends it to the State Deputy for his Approval. A copy of the resolution form the merging councils with the vote result should be attached.
- If the State Deputy approves the merger, he will forward the request with all the attachment it to the Regional Growth Director.
- Once the Regional Growth Director approves the merger, he in turn forwards the request and all the attachments to the supreme secretary for his action.
- The supreme secretary will present the request to the Board of Directors for their approval or rejection at their next meeting.

#### A Few Notes:

- 1. A new name could be adopted for the new council (see APPENDIX D).
- 2. We recommend keeping the lower council number.
- 3. All members, liabilities, debt etc. become the responsibility of the new council.

The past grand knights of each council shall retain all rights and privileges that pertain to past grand knights, and the grand knight of the council ceasing to exist by reason of the merger shall be entitled to the title, right and privileges of past grand knights without regard to the length of time served in such office. (SEC 249.2 Laws & Constitution)

### **REJUVINATE MEMBRSHIP INITIAIVE**

- Grand Knight Deputy Grand Knight Chancelor form a team
- Grand Knight appoints a Lecturer
- Grand Knight appoints a Membership Director and Retention Chair tor form a Membership Committee
- Knights of Columbus Fraternal Planner 2023-2024 is made available to all players and updated with Council activities.
- The calendar is reviewed and updated with requirements for the Columbian Award. (Family, Faith, Community, Life).
- Calendar is also reviewed and updated with membership goals and activities spread out quarterly.
- Council Roster is reviewed for resources drawing from the Associate and insurance members to sit on and man committees;
  - Honorary and Honorary for Life members are reviewed for their expertise and committee assignments.
- Member Interest/Experience Survey, sent to all members Form
   1842
- Form 185 (Officers Appointed for the Term) is submitted in July.
   Some information may not be available, but the form is submitted changes to follow.
- Form 365 (program activities personnel) is submitted ensuring key
  positions requiring safe environment training (GK, PD, CD, FD) are
  appointed.
- Council Audit due in August/February.
- Delta Church Drive is planned for October/March. Councill Church Drives are planned for throughout the year.
- Online Membership procedures are reviewed. Church bulletin articles are programmed. KofC.org/JoinUs is advertised to interest men to join online.
- Two Fraternal Benefits Events are programmed with the assistance of the Field Agent (Insurance).
- Fraternal Survey due in January.

### **POINTS TO PONDER**

- After a new member joins online, member must witness the Degree Exemplification via DVD, Online Presentation or Council/District Degree Team
- When it is found some members are not attending meetings or participating in activities, a 2-man team should be formed to investigate. Sickness, financial stress or lack of interest should be documented and acted upon.
- Remember, most men liked to be asked to join.

The key to recruiting new members is advertising the on-line membership program found at KofC.org/Join Us and following the word "JOIN". Using the brochure "Why Join" as a handout provides thought-provoking attributes on the Knights of Columbus, which can be used to run articles in the church bulletin. Submitting

articles in the Vermont Newsletter gains recognition for the council. When a copy is sent to you, distribute it to all members of the council. Maurice Noel will add you to the newsletter distribution roster.

Coordinate with your Pastor and ask him to incorporate his endorsement of the Knights of Columbus into his weekly homilies.

Recognize families at Masses with the Family of the Month program. Recognize members through the Knight of the Month Program. These two programs expand into Family of the Year and Knight of the year. (Family of the Month selections don't have to be council members.)

Coordinate with Dave Guiliani, Insurance Field Agent, and schedule two Fraternal Benefits Briefings for the community.

Schedule activities promoting membership, i.e., brunches, Spaghetti diners, caroling, lighting of the creche, etc. At these activities invite members and nonmembers to help set--up and serving. Include an advertisement such as the "Why Join" brochure and/or continuous playing of the video about the life and times of Fr. Michal J. McGivney.

As your interim District Deputy, I will at times remind you of reports that are due, but importantly assist you in endeavors. If you want me to attend meetings, you can schedule a zooming session and invite me.

I am a past District Deputy, Grand Knight and currently the VT State Membership Director. I'm loaded with ideas!

### **How To Recruit Former Members**

Former Knights are men who are familiar with the ideals of Columbians'. They left the Order at one time but represent a pool of prospects councils should not overlook in striving for membership growth.

- Appoint a special "Welcome Back Brother" or "Operation Re-Member" committee specifically to recruit former members. Past grand knights familiar with circumstances of earlier departures are especially suited.
- Obtain a list of "Former Members" (those who took withdrawals/suspensions) and "Inactive Insurance Members" (those who took withdrawals/suspensions but maintain K of C insurance policies) from the Department of Fraternal Mission. Check with your financial secretary for additional names and most recent addresses.
- Review the list to determine former members known to be residing in the area and still eligible for membership.
- Prepare information for a presentation for former members highlighting changes, new programs/activities/benefits and recent council achievements.
- Order promotional materials, such as Family Fraternal Benefits flyer (#2761), <u>Member/Spouse</u>
   <u>Fraternal Benefits flyer (#2773)</u>, etc., from Supplies Online. Prepare kits of these materials for distribution.
- If conducting personal visits, follow the procedure outlined on the "Using 2-on-1 Team Concept" page for recruitment teams, tailoring presentation to highlight new changes/benefits, etc.
- If planning a "Welcome Back" or former-member reception, use the open house procedures. Be sure to invite your council chaplain and insurance agent to speak at the event.
- Refer to the *Grand Knight's Handbook* (#915) Membership Procedures section for proper procedures for recruiting former members.
- Ask every former member visited or those at reception to sign Membership Document (#100) to renew membership.
- Contact each former member by phone to arrange a personal visit or invite them to a reception for former members.

**NOTE:** Reactivating inactive insurance members qualifies the council for both membership and insurance additions toward Father McGivney and Founders' Awards quotas.

**NOTE:** Reinstatements, readmissions or reapplications qualify the council for membership additions for the Father McGivney Award.

Per the Vermont State Bylaws, all Resolutions for the State Convention MUST be submitted to the Resolutions Committee by JANUARY 15th so that the State Advocate can provide proper notice of the Resolutions to the Councils. As such, just as was done this year, resolutions will NOT be accepted from the floor of the 126<sup>th</sup> Annual State Convention next year.

The resolution submitted to the Resolutions Committee need not be in official format; the Resolutions Committee will assist you with formatting, but you MUST get notice to the Resolutions Committee of your intention to submit a resolution on a particular topic by JANUARY 15<sup>th</sup>, 2024.

As a reminder, Resolutions are accepted on areas of importance to the State Council, the State of Vermont, the United States of America, or the world, but they must reflect the values of the Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus and must not propose a change in Church doctrine. All resolutions will be screened by the Resolutions Committee.

# Resolutions for 125<sup>th</sup> Vermont State Convention 2023 (Reprinted as Examples of Successful Resolutions)

### A Resolution Honoring Pope Francis, Our Bishop, & Supreme Council

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Knights of Columbus of the State of Vermont assembled in the 125<sup>th</sup> Annual Convention offer:

- A. To our most beloved and esteemed Sovereign Pontiff Pope Francis, our sincere best wishes for good health and long, fruitful spiritual leadership, with the assurance of our continued loyalty to the Holy Mother Church.
- B. To His Excellency, the Most Reverend Christopher Coyne, Bishop of Burlington, our pledge of love, support, and continued prayers for good health.
- C. To our Supreme Knight, Patrick Kelly, Supreme Chaplain, Supreme Council Officers and Supreme Board of Directors, our prayers that Almighty God will continue to grant them good health, wisdom, and inspiration for continued leadership for our Order.

### Honoring the Service of Pope Benedict XVI

WHEREAS Pope Benedict XVI served our Holy Catholic Church with pastoral leadership, and

WHEREAS he passed into the arms of his Loving Father on December 31, 2022,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the that the Knights of Columbus of the State of Vermont assembled in the 125th Annual Convention offer:

- A. Our prayers for the repose of his eternal soul; and
- B. Our sincere thanks and deepest respect for his service to God and to the Church.

### A Resolution Regarding an Increase in State Per Capita

WHEREAS the current annual State Per Capita rate is \$7.25/active member and was last changed in 2016, and

WHEREAS, if adjusted for inflation, according to the CPI Inflation Calculator at the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics that figure would be \$9.11/member today, and

WHEREAS the Vermont State Council has incurred increased expenses due to inflation while carrying out its roles in supporting the local Councils, and has recently undertaken to pay for liability insurance for all Councils and members in Vermont, an expense formerly borne by the local Councils.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that, beginning in the 2023-2024 Fraternal Year, the State Per Capita rate shall be \$8.50/member, and

FURTHER RESOLVED that all appropriate State Policies will be updated to reflect this change.

### A Resolution Regarding the Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities

WHEREAS the Vermont Knights of Columbus Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities, informally the "Tootsie Roll Program," was instituted to help councils raise money for charities that support individuals with intellectual disabilities, and

WHEREAS all councils are highly encouraged to enthusiastically promote and collect donations for the Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities to the best of their ability, during weekend drives between June 1st and October 31st, and

WHEREAS councils that participate in the annual Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities provide the Vermont State Council at least twenty percent (20%) of their total proceeds (plus expenses such as Tootsie Rolls, aprons, etc.) to support Camp O'Hagan,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that beginning in the 2023-2024 Fraternal Year, councils will provide the Campaign for People with Intellectual Disabilities Chairman a full accounting of their collection drive date(s), all collection proceeds, supply orders, and the names of and specific donations to council-selected charities that serve people with intellectual disabilities, and

FURTHER RESOLVED, that councils will, based on their accounting, calculate 20% of their proceeds and their expenses and will, instead of providing their full proceeds and receiving 80% back as was previously done, will submit only their accounting specified above and their check for at least 20% of proceeds before expenses, made out to the "Vermont State Council," directly to the campaign Chairman, with the check to be deposited directly in the Vermont State Council's Camp O'Hagan Fund.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Vermont State Council and all local Councils shall remain, today and always, as loyal to the Catholic Church and to the Order and principles of the Knights of Columbus as they have been over the past 125 years.



### **RSVP Form 2863 APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS**

**REQUIREMENTS:** For every \$500 given to an individual seminarian or religious aspirant, Supreme will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported. In addition to financial support, Councils are also required to provide some form of moral and spiritual support for their success.

The following persons are eligible to receive RSVP funds: Seminarians who have been accepted by a diocese and are currently in their "spirituality" year Seminarians attending major seminaries (usually four years) in preparation for priestly ordination Seminarians in their "pastoral" year (most often when they are deacons) Seminarians attending college seminaries (sometimes called minor seminaries) Seminarians who belong to a religious institute and are currently in formation for the priesthood (religious seminarians often are called "Brother" even though they will eventually be ordained as priests Men and women who are novices or postulants in religious orders or religious communities

The following persons are NOT eligible to receive RSVP Funds: Priests or religious seeking assistance for continuing education • Candidates for the permanent diaconate Religious brothers not currently studying for the priesthood

# SECTION I AND II MUST BE COMPLETED TO BE ELIGIBLE FOR THE RSVP CERTIFICATE

**DIRECTIVES FOR SECTION I: REFUND INFORMATION** To qualify for the refund, the following conditions must be met: Money given to each individual must be vocation-related, donated between July 1 and June 30 within the fraternal year applied for, and must amount to at least \$500 per individual. The money must have been given to an individual and NOT to an institution or fund (e.g., a seminary or diocesan fund). Money must be given to a seminarian, postulant or novice only. The money must be paid with a check drawn on the council/assembly account. Copies of any canceled check(s) (both front and back sides) or other documentation must be attached to this RSVP2863 form. If using documentation other than canceled check(s), you must include both a financial statement, such as a council bank statement, and a letter of receipt from the seminarian.





Each box also contains a special note addressed to: A Friend. This year the program donated hats, mittens, socks and other personal items to Spectrum Youth Services and Joseph's House in Burlington. Both groups do community outreach to those most in need. Joesph's House also received a cash donation.
