I have enjoyed writing the State Deputy news magazine articles for our state jurisdiction over the past 2 years! It is always a balance of positive communication, encouragement and information as well as to highlight or plead for us to capture the opportunities we have as a jurisdiction.

Here are my reflections going into June:

- 1. Membership! At the time of this typing, we are at 102 new members. That is again, one of the highest numbers we've achieved in the past decade! Our target is 120. Can we get 18 new Knights in next 30 days??
- I ask (and plead) that we try! Do what you can... remember that one man you see at Mass that you been thinking of asking? How about that co-worker that you know is Catholic? Please don't wait any longer... ASK someone to join and if you are shy... refer them to our Supreme website or ask your DD/GK for material (softcopy and pamphlets avail) to hand them after you ask.
- Look, we did a lot of great charitable work this FY. We have ~3443 active Knights in VT... but just look at your council... do you have 2+ Knights seeking every council position?? Probably not, we need more members to keep our councils vital and healthy!
- 2. Congratulations to Bishop Elect John McDermott!! We are all so very proud and happy for Bishop Elect McDermott... a VT Knight of Columbus who is now a Bishop! We are blessed!!! This Monday, IPSD Steve Shover, myself and State Chaplain Fr. Tim Naples will present Bishop Elect McDermott with a croiser (Staff) on behalf of the VT Knights of Columbus. Supreme also sent Bishop Elect a nice congratulatory letter which I also received a copy of.
- 3. Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP): Please use this link for the online form to document the funds you raised for VT's Pregnancy Centers and related organizations. kofc.org/asap Supreme does have a matching contribution. Also, I think VT has among the highest raised funds for ASAP per capita... Typically the bigger states like NY, Texas, CA etc raise \$50K or more.... When I reviewed the various emails that I have received during the FY... I believe VT KofC Councils have raised at least \$20K... If we consider that amount per member... that is impressive for a FY. Please take the time to document to Supreme using this simple 30 second online link. You do need the EIN for the organization. I sent an email to all GKs, FS and DDs on this earlier in the week. 4. Donor Advised Fund (DAF)

On May 30th, DD2 George, DD4 Chris, myself (SD) and State Chaplain Fr. Naples met with VT Catholic Community Foundation's Interim Executive Director Melanie Sheehan and Finance Director Denise Watson to review our FY 23-24 Fund's distribution. A complete summary of the fund is avail.. just ask.

Here is our recommendations which we provide to the VCC:

The decision made for this year's DAF distribution was to continue to support youth/young adult ministry at the following levels:

- 1) \$2,000 toward the Catholic Center at UVM (serving both UVM and Chaplain colleges), roughly 30%
- 2) \$4,655.04 toward the Totus Tuus program at the Diocese, roughly 70%
- 5. In the past 2 years as your State Deputy, I have certainly taken the time to thank all of our Brother Knights for joining our organization and those men who have stepped up into our much need Council, District, State and State Committee Leadership Positions!! I have been able to personally recognize several great Knights with the Anchor Award, State Deputy Merit Awards, Certificates, etc. etc. We have so many wonderful Men in our organization and as I visited councils, attended meetings, installations, events, I'm always very happy to see what I call 'liked minded Catholic Men' who view the Knights as a vocation. You never hear them say 'I'm too busy' or 'I have to ask my wife...' or 'new job's a hassle and the kids got the flu...' (recall that song?) These are the Men who take leadership, support and 'ownership' of our Order to heart! I again thank you. I do want to recognize in my last news article one Knight that has ALWAYS been there for me whenever I or the State have needed a Leader. You will all agree that he represents the best of us! My thanks go to George Piette. He is simply amazing and I appreciate everything he does for the VT KofC!! God Bless you (and Retha) George!
- 6. I want to wish our State Deputy Elect Christopher Poirier the best of luck and to his State Officers. I"m excited to be the IPSD and will do my best to support SD-Elect Chris and the VT KofC!
- 7. Lastly, I want to thank my wife, Rose for her unfaltering support of the KofC! Besides helping out and supporting many events in the past 2+ years, she has enable me to work all day and then spend a few hours each evening returning phone calls (to Knights), attending State and Territorial meetings and travel around the state during the weekends so we may attend Mass and Events at other councils. She is very much a part of the KofC as all our spouses are!!

BISHOP-ELECT McDermott's Ordination Mass

Bishop-Elect McDermott's Ordination Mass itself will be a ticketed event – with each parish getting a set number of tickets as will be very limited open seating in the Cathedral. We will certainly have an honor guard for the procession but will probably be limited in the number that processes.

There will be a Vespers Service the night before (6 pm on Sunday, July 14 at the Cathedral) that will be open to the public – no tickets required. All Knights and their families are welcome to come. It will be at the Vespers service that the Bishop-Elect will greet any civic officials that attend (it's custom to invite the Governor, VT Congressional Delegation, Mayor of Burlington, Police and Fire Chiefs, and the Adjutant General of the VTNG) as well as the area ecumenical and interfaith leaders.

Where assistance will most certainly be needed – beyond an honor guard – are folks helping greet/ushering/seating people (general crowd control inside and outside the Cathedral) and possibly with parking. The Cathedral and (hopefully) former school lot will be reserved only for people with handicapped placards, for Bishops and Cardinals, and certain ministers & volunteers. Otherwise, parking will be either at St. Mike's College or the Hilton Waterfront – with busses bringing people to and from the Cathedral.

We'll probably need upwards of 25 or so people to help with ushering (fewer for Vespers). Between the Cathedral ushers, student greeters, and the Knights of Columbus, I think we can find the necessary help. More information and an official request for assistance will be forthcoming from the Office of Worship.







The first is the St. Joseph Pilgrim Icon, the latest in a series of Pilgrim Icons since 1979. The Icon itself is a large (30" x 36") framed painting. The Pilgrim Icons are a Faith activity in the Faith in Action program, and every 3-4 years Supreme comes out with a new one to send to each state. We have two; one is up in the NEK right now and the other is sitting at my house. So, between those two, I should be able to get one to you most anytime you wish. The St. Joseph Pilgrim Icon comes with prayer service booklets. The Prayer Service includes reciting the Holy Rosary. It can also be coupled with a Mass if your Chaplain wishes.

The second Icon is the Silver Rose. The Silver Rose is an actual rose made of silver (see below). The Silver Rose is a Life activity in the Faith in Action program. It promotes the dignity of and respect for life, and honors Our Lady of Gaudalupe. There are 8 Silver Roses which each year travel assigned routes throughout Canada, the U.S. and Mexico. We will be receiving our Silver Rose from NH on July 14 and will have it until August 3 when we transfer it to MA. So it is only available here in VT during that 3-week period in late July. It also comes with prayer service booklets similar to the Pilgrim Icon. If your Council would like to sponsor a Silver Rose service in late July, let me know of the date(s) that you are thinking of. Several Councils have already expressed an interest, and I will try my best to accommodate everyone. Usually that is not a problem though.





- · Grand Knight lays out his vision and membership goals.
- GK meets with the Council Membership Director and Retention Chair Committee.
- GK meets separately with the Chaplain/Priest to identify eligible practical Catholics to be recommended for KofC membership.
- Procedures are reviewed for the On-Line membership program.
- The Council Calendar is developed and reviewed.
- At least two church drives are planned.
- Form 165 (Officers Elected for the Term) and 385 (Service Program Personnel Report) are reviewed and completed.
- · Review and recognize the State/Supreme programs and outstanding performers
- Review actions recommended after new members are recruited, such as "Shining Armor Award".
- Follow these "best practices"
 - When you are in the need of manpower
 - Don't ask, designate and/or appoint
 - When you're not getting input or feedback
 - Circle the wagons
 - Seek input from everyone
 - Draw conclusions
 - Establish consensus
 - Focus on novel ideas
 - Meetings must be focused, orderly
 - Robert's Rules of Order

- Use the Gavel
- Suspend the rules for a portion of the meeting and "Problem Solve"
- DD'S Communicate with GKs
- o Phone, not email
- Ask about how they're doing, how their family is doing, what they're struggling with, what's working for them, etc. and also talk membership
- Identify a technology "point-person" for the council to assist officers in virtual meetings and programming
