



I am pleased to repeat the regular reminder of the theme of <u>Cor</u> formation in the faith.


Again, Cor is prayer and fraternity for all men, led by Knights., or just supported by K. of C. members in any parish.

First, the ONLY councils currently Safe Environment compliant are Councils #10417 and #10830; all other councils, please check your status and get your officers compliant.

Next, per the Vermont State Bylaws, all resolutions and ideas for resolutions for the State Convention MUST be submitted to the Resolutions Committee by JANUARY 15th, 2025 so that the State Advocate can provide proper notice of the resolutions to the Councils. As such, just as was done this and last year, resolutions will NOT be accepted from the floor of the 127th Annual State Convention next year.

The resolution submitted to the Resolutions Committee need not be in official format; the Resolutions Committee will assist you with formatting, but you MUST get notice to the Resolutions Committee of your intention to submit a resolution on a particular topic by JANUARY 15th, 2025.

As a reminder, Resolutions are accepted on areas of importance to the State Council, the State of Vermont, the United States of America, or the world, but they must reflect the values of the Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus and must not propose a change in Church doctrine. All resolutions will be screened by the Resolutions Committee.

All Knights are welcome to join the Resolutions Committee! In order to contact the Resolutions Committee regarding your intention to submit a resolution, or to volunteer to serve on the Resolutions Committee, please contact me at: elijahtlachance@gmail.com. Vocations The Future of Our Church

As the strong right arm of the church, the Knights of Columbus are committed to providing moral, financial and spiritual support to future priests and religious at all stages of their formation. The future of our church is directly tied to people answering God's call to a religious vocation. Promoting vocations to the priesthood and religious life is one of our highest priorities of the Knights of Columbus.

The RSVP (Refund Support Vocations Program) has been and is the primary program through which Knights of Columbus councils, and assemblies participate in an organized manner in supporting vocations to the priesthood and religious life. Councils are required to provide financial support of at least \$500 for a minimum of one seminarian. Councils are also required to provide their "adopted" seminarian or religious aspirant with moral support and prayers for their success. This is a central aspect of RSVP and must be fulfilled to satisfy the program requirements. For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported.

Our Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP) Scholarship money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, clerical clothing, emergency expenditures and other living expenses.

I ask that all our councils work with me as your State Vocations Director to ensure the proper and complete implementation of the RSVP program to ensure that every seminarian sponsored by the diocese is included in the RSVP program.

Sponsors and Faithful Navigators should accompany their candidates. Do not allow a candidate to attend the degree alone.

Candidates must have a current third-degree membership card in their possession as it will be checked. The celebration of Mass is an essential part of the degree. All candidates and families are encouraged to participate.

Dress for candidates and 4th Degree members: Black or dark (blue or grey) business suit with black socks and black shoes, white dress shirt (no button-down collars or French cuffs), and tie. A black tuxedo is

optional but if worn, it must be worn with a white pleated tuxedo shirt with a lay-down collar (no ruffles or French collars) a black bow tie, and cummerbund (no vests). We are honored to have active-duty Military personnel and encourage them to wear their dress uniform. If you are full-time police and firefighters may wear a Class A or dress uniform. 

District Master Letter

With summer coming to an end, now is our opportunity to offer events that give our members things to do and places to gather. Offer dinners once or twice a month and plan activities that your membership can support and join. Start using these events to promote your Councils and Assembly for prospective Members as well and it is never too early to start planning your future events. National Patriotism Week is September 9-15. You still have time to download a proclamation for National Patriotism Week and have your city's mayor sign. Then take advantage of the many forms and certificates you can use to recognize program

participants and volunteers.

Patriot Day is a United States national observance on September 11 to remember those who were injured or killed during the terrorist attacks in the United States on September 11, 2001, when four planes were hijacked. The hijackers then deliberately flew three of the planes into two important buildings, the Pentagon in Washington DC, and the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in New York. The fourth crashed into a field near Shanksville, Pennsylvania. The loss of life and damage that these hijackings caused from the biggest act of terrorism ever on United States soil. Nearly 3000 people died in the attacks and the economic impact was immense. In observance of this National Day of Mourning, please look for ways that your assembly can participate in remembering those who sacrificed their lives to save, protect, and defend our country. 1) Recruit more new Sir Knights to enable us to increase our support to our Dioceses and Parishes. Our challenge will be to: 1) Invite members of your parish to become a Knight of Columbus (make every event a recruiting opportunity) 2) Invite every Third-Degree member of your Council to become a Fourth-Degree member of your Assembly. 3) Invite every Fourth-Degree member of your Assembly to acquire a Uniform and Regalia (if they do not already have it) and become active in your Assemblies Color Corps. Remember, this is not about numbers, it is about strengthening our ability as an organization to better serve our Church and our Clergy!!

Our SD Chris, my son David and I will be participating in the 2024 Provincial Meeting for the Bishop James Healy Province of the Knights of Columbus will be at September 27-28 at Saint Anthony's Franciscan Monastery (framon.net) in Kennebunkport, Maine! If you would like to be on my team, I have an office opening to fill. I need District Marshal South, Military Liaison / VAVS, Director of Membership and Director of Programs let me know if you are in All District Masters from Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Vermont, Connecticut, and Rhode Island will convene to kick off the 125th Anniversary Year of the Fourth-Degree culminating with an Exemplification of the Fourth Degree on February 22, 2025, in New York City! We will be joined by Provincial Friar Fr. Jean-Paul Labrie, Worthy State Deputies from Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Vermont, Connecticut, and Rhode Island along with include an Installation Mass and Blessing of Swords on Saturday 28. An Honor Guard call-out will be forthcoming for those in regalia who may wish to participate. We are pleased to announce that Supreme Master Michael R. McCusker will be coming that weekend.

Protocol for the use of the Color Corps (Honor and Color Guard)

It is with great pleasure that I am witnessing a significant increase in requests for the services of the Fourth Degree at ceremonies and Masses. As these ceremonies and Masses continue to be requested, there have been some questions regarding if/when the District Master should be notified with regard to coordinating such events. As such, I feel this is the appropriate time to communicate my expectations regarding those events and activities, and when the District Master should be notified.

If a Priest makes a request of the Faithful Navigator and his Assembly to participate in a ceremony or Mass of the Parish, it is the decision of the Faithful Navigator to accept or decline, based on membership participation for the event. However, we must remember that it is very important to support the wishes of the Priest. In such instances as this, the District Master does not need to be contacted to coordinate this event. However, I ask that you notify one of the Marshals nearest to you. He is available to assist in any way if requested. If you don't know who the Marshals are, just go to the State website, under "4th Degree" and they are listed with contact information.

If a request comes in from a family, due the death of a brother, Fourth Degree or not, this request should be honored. It is also allowed to have an Honor Guard for the deceased immediate family members of a brother Knight. The key word is "IMMEDIATE". We must ensure that the details are worked out with the Parish Priest. It is also perfectly acceptable to have an Honor Guard for one who will be interned in a columbarium. Again, you must work out the details with the Parish Priest.

On the other hand, if a request for the Forth Degree is made at a Regional or Diocesan level (usually through the bishop); the District Master needs to be notified before a commitment is

made. To assist me in such duties, I will enlist the help of my District Marshal and/or an Assistant Marshal that I have appointed in various areas across the State. When I receive such notification from you for this type of event, I will ask them to contact you to offer assistance to you and your Assembly in coordinating the event. This is not meant to have them "take over", but to act as a guide and mentor. In most cases, they have had experience with such events in the past.

The request for installation of Assembly Officers and to do the Renewal of Obligations must come through. It is his responsibility to either preside at these ceremonies or appoint someone to act on his behalf.

Though I'm sure we want to participate as much as we can, we must also be sensitive to the time sacrifices made by our Sir Knights. It is almost always a good idea to solicit assistance from nearby Assemblies. Let's work together as a team and support each other.

If a Sir Knight shows up for any activity involving the Color Corps, not properly dressed, he is NOT to participate.

Color Corps Commanders must know and follow the proper Color Corps protocol as currently called out in the Color Corps Drill Manual. The excuse "this how we've always done it" is not acceptable and will not be tolerated. There is no excuse for not having access to the Drill Manual. It is on the State website under the "4th Degree" section and can be downloaded and printed out. It can also be ordered from Supreme.

I would be remiss if I did not close by encouraging you to have in-person contact with your Councils to recruit new Sir Knights. We need younger brothers to assure our future, and to continue the high visibility of the Fourth Degree of our Order.

Please feel free to contact me or one of my Marshals if you have any questions. If we don't immediately have the answer, we will find out and get back to you as quickly as possible. Do not have your Assembly meeting with your council meeting it is not allowed by the Supreme offices. It is not okay to do.

REPORT OF ELECTION OF OFFICERS was due June 30, 2024 – Your Faithful Comptroller must enter the 2024-2025 council officers into Member Management Council Administration immediately after the election in May/June 2024. Be sure to make the entries as "Next Year Officers" and not as "Current Officers" (unless you are past the 6/30 deadline and the newly elected have become "Current Year"). This must be immediately followed by the generation in the Member Management Print Center of Report #2 (Report of Next Year Officers) (use Report #1 if past 6/30), which you then send to the Supreme Master, Vice Supreme Master and the District Master. These actions replace the use of the old form 185, which, although still available, should NOT be used. These actions also eliminate the need for use of the old state directory change form as the report will be forwarded to the A&F Chairman, so please discontinue use of the "change form." The Faithful Navigators, should ensure that the Faithful Comptroller has taken care of this as required.

STATE DIRECTORY CHANGE is due immediately – At the beginning of the fraternal year and again at any time there is a change in either name or any of the contact information for

the Faithful Navigators, Comptrollers, Assembly Friars, and Color Core

Commander, Assembly should inform the State. The directory is updated as reports are received and is the most current information available. Please review the meeting information (dates and places) in the directory and make sure it is correct and that it exactly matches the official meeting information in Member Management Council Administration. Any updates or changes in meeting information should be sent in email to the A&F Chairman. The VT State Directory is not currently available on the VT website, due to potential security issues

Assembly AUDITS (Form 1315) are due August 15. Every Assembly is required to perform an Assembly audit. This should be done as soon as possible. Copies of both audits should be sent to the Supreme Master, Vice Supreme Master and the District Master. Is anyone interested if we starting a district officers meeting online every other month to go over. What's going on in the 4th degree? This will be talking about forms and how to fill them out. What upcoming on Honor guard services that is coming up in the diocese or your area. Let The district Master know if you are willing to participating. It will be in zoom.

<u>Uniform Talk</u> <u>The Color Corp of the Patriotic Degree</u>

Purpose of the Color Corps

When knighthood was in flower, knights carried the sword to defend their God, their Church, their country and their fellow man according to the code of chivalry. Today, Sir Knights wear regalia and carry the sword to honor Christ and His apostles, especially on religious and civic occasions specified in this manual. Hence, the primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to encourage active Catholic citizenship and foster the spirit of patriotism in members and the community at large.

The Color Corps members exemplify all the principles of our Order: Charity - by the gift of their time and energies necessary to practice, perfect and perform the ceremonials and sword drill;

- Unity by the united efforts of Sir Knights to practice and perfect a coordinated drill for the good of the Church and the Order;
- Fraternity by expressing an "Esprit de Corps," sharing a common desire for drill excellence and camaraderie; and
- Patriotism by performing precision drill as a salute to God and to country and visually exhibiting a love for both.

The public appearance of Fourth Degree Knights as a Color Corps at religious and civic functions is an important activity of each assembly. By these public demonstrations, their loyalty and patriotism bring credit to themselves and to the Knights of Columbus.

SHAPING & WEARING of the Beret

Official Fourth Degree Black Unlined Beret with Fourth Degree metal badge to be worn over the left eye. Shaping Instructions:

1. Wet the beret. Soak the beret in warm water. If your beret has a flash or other insignia, keep it away from the water as much as possible. If your insignia is removable, we suggest you remove the insignia prior to this step. Note: Using hot water on the black rim will shrink the beret. If your beret is slightly too large, using hot water is a good idea. If your beret already fits your head snugly, be sure to avoid hot water 2. Wring out the excess water. Get rid of all the extra water you can by gently wringing out the beret. It will still be damp, but make sure there is no more dripping water.

3. Shape the beret. Place the damp beret on your head. Pull the beret up to make it stand. Pull all excess fabric down on the right side of your head by folding it with your hands. Repeat this action several times, making sure the fabric on top is completely smooth.

4. Allow the beret to dry on your head. Doing this will keep the beret from shrinking too much and will form the beret more closely to the exact shape of your head. If necessary, you may need to hold the fold down with one hand until it becomes secure. You may take the beret off if it's still slightly damp after a few hours.

Serving Those Who Served

Knights of Columbus Veteran's Affairs Service Program



When our country needed them, our veterans answered the call to serve. Now members of the Fourth Degree are being called to serve our veterans through a new program: "Serving Those Who Served." Our goal is to have an active corps of Knights serving as volunteers at every Veteran's Administration medical facility in the nation. Patriotism is the principle of the Fourth Degree. Perhaps the ultimate patriotic expression is showing care and concern by "Serving Those Who Served." The Fourth Degree needs you and our veterans need you.

Volunteers are needed at Veteran's medical facilities on a regular basis. Through the "Serving Those Who Served" program assemblies are asked to form a corps of volunteers to meet the needs of our veterans on an ongoing basis. Just some volunteer opportunities for Fourth Degree Knights include:

- Coordinating volunteer activities matching the volunteers available with the needs of hospitalized veterans;
- Supporting the Catholic Chaplains in their ministry of spiritual support to our Catholic patients;

- · Encourage councils, auxiliaries, and Squires circles to support VAVS activities;
- Sponsor VAVS youth volunteers;
- Providing reception and information services working in reception areas to provide information to visitors;
- Helping make patients comfortable by distributing toiletries, sweaters and other items that help make veterans more comfortable;
- Providing "Pet Therapy" bringing pets to facility to interact with the veterans at appropriate places and times;
- Vocational rehabilitation helping or providing the opportunity for veterans to participate in job skills programs;
- Arts and crafts providing materials and programs that help veterans use artistic and creative skills;
- Patient visiting;
- · Patient check-in and patient escort;
- Offering holiday celebrations organizing parties for veterans;
- · Taking patients to ball games or performances when possible; and
- · Hosting picnics, parties or recreation outings.



Upon discharge from the VA facility some veterans find they have lost touch with friends and family. They need human companionship and a friendly, dependable Fourth Degree volunteer might be "just what the doctor ordered." Discharged veterans need compassionate, caring and committed individuals to:

 Help them access community events and services; Share their time by visiting them, listening to them and talking with them;

- · Note changes in the patient's condition and inform the healthcare team; and
- Remember them on birthdays, holidays and other special occasions.

Many assemblies are not located close enough to a Veteran's medical facility to make regular efforts practical. However, they may still participate in and make a valuable contribution to the "Serving Those Who Served" program. The possibilities are limited only by the imagination and the needs of the veterans. For instance:

- Organize a drive to collect clothing, coats, gloves, pajamas, robes, toiletries, etc. for veterans;
- Organize program to provide rosaries, bibles, Catholic religious literature, and Chapel items like mass bells, Easter candle holders, altar lines;
- Volunteer as Eucharistic Ministers to take Communion to bed patients;
- Collecting or developing a plan to buy television sets, VCRs, DVD players or stereo equipment to donate for use in medical facility common areas;
- Collect video and audio tapes, books, DVD and CD disks for the facility;
- Develop a plan to donate personal computers and computer programs, printers and other peripherals (as well paper and ink) for use by veterans;
- Travel to a VA facility to put on a special program or entertainment for patients;
- Plan and conduct a special outing, if possible, for veterans such as a picnic, a trip to the ballpark or a special community event;
- Plan a special holiday event and travel to the facility to conduct it for the veterans; or
- Adopt veterans at a distant facility and remember them regularly with cards and letters.

2024 cigarette butt litter cleanup

Hello Brother Knights,

First off – I want to thank you very much for helping with the cigarette butt litter clean ups these past five (5) years either in the Georgia Industrial Park or in St. Albans (Downtown, Industrial Park, and the Bay Park).

To give a little introduction of the topic.

Back in the early summer of 2020, The Franklin / Grand Isle Tobacco Prevention Coalition (FGITPC) came onto a zoom call at the Downtown St. Albans Board meeting. As you know, I am a part of the

Downtown St. Albans Board. The individual who spoke during that general forum session of the meeting is also a part of the Northwestern Medical Center Community Hospital. She introduced the topic. At that point in time, she was already doing cigarette butt litter clean ups in Franklin and Grand Isle for the past four (4) years as she began this endeavour in 2016. As you know – this was during the start of COVID-19, hence the reason for the zoom call. During that call, the individual introduced the topic, asked for help, and that night I told the board that I would help lead the charge of promoting this cigarette butt litter clean up in Downtown St. Albans. That year we had 27 volunteers (wearing face masks) from various organizations (Downtown St. Albans, K of C, Rotary Club of St. Albans, friends, and community) carrying a gallon size zip lock bag, a claw grabber (if they had one), wearing gloves, walking around downtown St. Albans picking up and counting the number of cigarettes (butts) they picked up to report location and tally. Over the years, I continued to help with promoting the event and also by bringing in volunteers to the various sites.

Congratulations!!!

We just completed our fifth year of participation of this community activity – I wanted to thank you for helping at either of these sites.

The question I hear often - is what is done with the information:

After each cigarette butt event – a week or two later, The Chair from FGITPC will send a letter to the town administrator / manager, the city, the mayor, and to the various print and social media forums.

Here is a snippet highlighting the reason for the cigarette butt litter clean ups.

- 1. Cigarette Butts are made of a plastic material. Because they are plastic, they do not biodegrade and can remain present in the environment for 20-25 years.
- Cigarette filters can release toxins back into the environment, especially into our waterways. Any trash, not to mention unsafe tobacco litter, is easily blown or washed into waterways directly or through storm drain, etc.
- We wanted to know how much tobacco litter exists in this location and where it might be concentrated.
- 4. We want to raise awareness throughout the community about litter and quitting.

My Personal Note: During my time walking around picking up litter – there were times where filters were located on or near sewer drains.

Below are approximate numbers of cigarette butt litter picked up at these locations during these years.

Think about the locations that you helped at - you were a part of a big help!

Thank you so much! In the past five years I have seen 11 different brothers Knights help representing from Milton, St. Albans, Swanton, and Richford.
