STATE DEPUTY'S MESSAGE

Brother Knights of the Vermont Jurisdiction,

Let's talk politics...well, maybe NOT! As thoughtful and civically minded citizens, Knights would like to openly advocate for certain politicians when we engage in meaningful conversations with our brothers, but we are actually <u>prohibited</u> from **engaging in partisan politics** in our meetings, functions, gatherings, or K of C social media postings. To be



clear, we have every right as Americans to talk about and openly support our preferred political candidates, but we should never do this when this support is directly or indirectly linked to our identity as Knights. There are several reasons for this, not the least of which are the legal restrictions imposed on us as a 501(c)(8) nonprofit organization called a Fraternal Benefits Society. But even more importantly is the fact that the political climate today is so highly-charged, polarized, and divisive that it is not reflective of the openness, mercy, and Christian charity that we should extend to all people, especially our brother Knights. We can discuss the issues, just not the parties or people that support those issues. Remember, our primary allegiance is to our Lord Jesus Christ, his "one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church, and those Catholic values, doctrines, and teachings that exceed all other social & political positions. Knights are neither "Democrat" or "Republican" - we are Catholics first! We are often advised to "follow our conscience" when making voting decisions, but this statement is grossly over-simplified. You must first have a well-formed conscience that is rooted in Faith in order to make proper political decisions. Pope Francis recognizes the dilemma we often face as Americans when we try to "vote Catholic," but neither candidate solidly represents our Christian morality or perspective. The Pope implores us to "choose the lesser of the two evils," which is not to implicate the candidates as "evil persons," but rather employs a time honored philosophical technique of ethical decision-making when all courses-of-action are flawed and we have to make the best choice. Remember, when weighing our decisions, not all issues are created equal. The preeminent issues are those that pose the greatest threat to the inalienable rights of life and liberty. 


Bishop McDermott has approved a bulletin insert for our Catholic parishes in this month, made and distributed by Vermont Right to Life Committee.

The On-Demand ceremony can be accessed by candidates online 24 hours a day. But before inviting a candidate to participate in the On-Demand ceremony, make sure your council has completed their standard admissions process and has collected the information needed for his form 100. 


The Silver Rose's 2024 journey through Vermont was completed in early August when it was transferred to the Massachusetts jurisdiction.

VOCATIONS

The Future of Our Church

As the strong right arm of the church, the Knights of Columbus are committed to providing moral, financial and spiritual support to future priests and religious at all stages of their formation. The future of our church is directly tied to people answering God's call to a religious vocation. Promoting vocations to the priesthood and religious life is one of our highest priorities of the Knights of Columbus.

The RSVP (Refund Support Vocations Program) has been and is the primary program through which Knights of Columbus councils, and assemblies participate in an organized manner in supporting vocations to the priesthood and religious life.

Councils are required to provide financial support of at least \$500 for a minimum of one seminarian. Councils are also required to provide their "adopted" seminarian or religious aspirant with moral support and prayers for their success. This is a central aspect of RSVP and must be fulfilled in order to satisfy the program requirements

. For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported.

Our Refund Support Vocations Program (RSVP) Scholarship money is used by seminarians and those in religious formation for books, car insurance and maintenance, travel during vacations, clerical clothing, emergency expenditures and other living expenses.

I ask that all our councils work with me as your State Vocations Director to ensure the proper and complete implementation of the RSVP program to ensure that every seminarian sponsored by the diocese is included in the RSVP program.






You Never Know Who You Will Meet at a Supreme Convention




Rescuing One to Heal Another

Many veterans suffer from strong feelings of separation, isolation, loss of hope and lack of support. Too often many of these men and women suffering from Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)) and/or Traumatic Brain Injury (TBI) have been driven to suicide. Members of Assembly 2050 decided to do something and come to the aid of veterans and firefighters at risk through supporting the *Rescuing One to Heal Another Program*. The program begins with the assembly rescuing dogs destined to be euthanized. These dogs undergo several months of therapy dog training through Blue Star Service Dogs and are then matched with an at-risk veteran. The entire process – which is supported by volunteer labor and financial support from the assembly, which also works raising awareness of the program – takes about a year. The Knights raised \$12,712.85 for the program in the past year. The funds were raised in a variety of ways including a car show, spaghetti and wild game dinners. Blue Star successfully pairs approximately 16 service dogs per year with a deserving veteran or firefighter.




