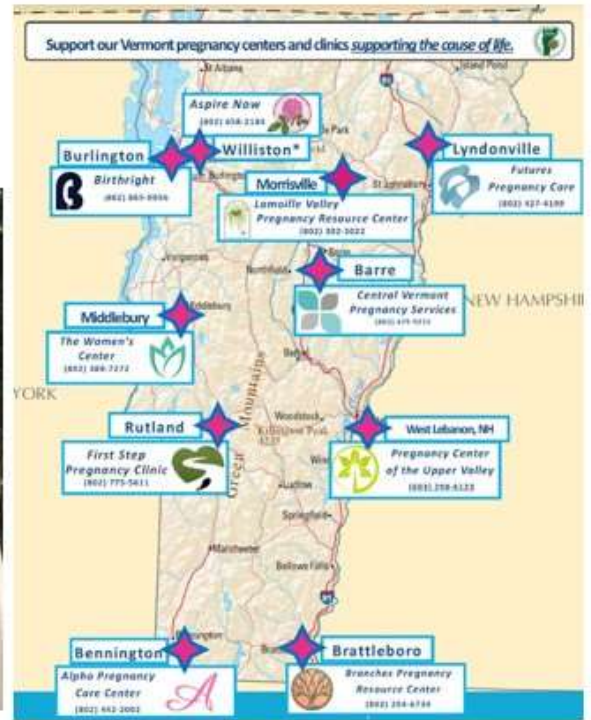

This will allow you to get all of your info down as you complete it and have it still fresh in your mind. Use the Form # STSP to record info and PLEASE submit a separate write up and pictures to increase your chances of winning an award at the State Convention. We don't do programs to get praise or recognition but is nice when we are rewarded for the good deeds we do. The cutoff for submissions to me is March 29, 2025, The State judging committee will be meeting in the first week of April to determine the winners in each category.

Please mail to me if possible , e-mail is OK as well , but I only have a black & white laser printer and you won't get as nice a presentation. I will accept ALL submissions for any award submissions in the 4 categories:

-FAITH, -FAMILY, -COMMUNITY, -LIFE

There are separate forms for Blessed Michael McGivney-Chaplain of the year award and I will also be accepting nominations for Family of the Year and Knight of the Year as well .. I think each Council should have no problem having a nomination for all 3 of those categories, as all of your Councils certainly have a Worthy Chaplain , Brother Knight and Family , which easily meet those criteria. The forms are simple and pictures and testimonials certainly help. Also, your FS should submit to me the longest continuous serving Brother from your Council so that he can be recognized . **This award is for continuous service , not First Degree date.**

Please remember that the Star Council requirements for this Fraternal year, they are:

Columbian Award – for the Programs you all do ,reported on Form# SP-7 by June 30. Categories listed above and complete 4 programs in each category , 16 total required , Featured programs = 2 points each

McGivney Award – for Membership . 5% increase over last years member number on your roster.

Founders Award – for Insurance . No quota this year , Council must participate in at least 2 Online or in person approved Insurance benefit informational meetings . Must have 7 members in attendance. **New- Council must submit form # 11077 .**

Safe Environment training - Required for specified leadership positions: Grand Knight , Community , Program and Family Directors. **This applies to Columbian and State Awards , please make sure you are compliant to be considered.**

Also , Form #365 Service Program Personnel report and Form #1728 Annual Survey for Fraternal Activity must be submitted and all assessments paid to Supreme and State Councils.

Please submit your awards for consideration , it is not too early , Good Luck and Vivat Jesus!

First, the ONLY councils currently Safe Environment compliant are Councils #297, #10417 and #10830; all other councils, please check your status and get your officers compliant. I am happy to work with councils individually.

Next, per the Vermont State Bylaws, all resolutions and ideas for resolutions for the State Convention MUST be submitted to the Resolutions Committee by JANUARY 15th, 2025 so that the State Advocate can provide proper notice of the resolutions to the Councils. As such, just as was done this and last year, resolutions will NOT be accepted from the floor of the 127th Annual State Convention next year.

The resolution submitted to the Resolutions Committee need not be in official format; the Resolutions Committee will assist you with formatting, but you MUST get notice to the Resolutions Committee of your intention to submit a resolution on a particular topic by JANUARY 15th, 2025.



Past State Deputy Message

A few thoughts on making Successful Councils

Resources - The Supreme Council, State Council and District Deputy are your best resources for a successful Council. The Supreme Council offers a wealth of information and guidance through its website www.kofc.org and Fraternal Services webinars. Your State Officers and particularly your District Deputy and Field Agent are knowledgeable and experienced and want your Council to excel. As you have heard in past ceremonials, we are eager for your success, all you need to do is ask for help.

Projects and awards - Earning Supreme and State Council awards are solid measures of your Councils success. Some years ago, Gilles Balenger, our former Supreme Program Consultant, would say if you fail to plan, you plan to fail. Officers working as a team meet regularly for event planning and goal setting with these awards in mind. The Supreme Council Columbian award requires four programs in each of these four areas: Faith, Family, Community and Life, with featured programs in each area offering 2 Columbian credits. The submission deadline is June 30. The State Council also recognizes the top program in each of these areas, with a mid-March deadline for award consideration. Achieve your program goals and your Council will be proud to have served your parish and community in very substantive ways. Councils that meet Supreme Council program, new member and Insurance member goals can receive the prestigious Star Award.

10784 Program Form Submission - a project isn't finished until the form is filed. Form 10784 is used to report Council projects in the four main areas. This pleasant task falls on the Program Director / Deputy Grand Knight. Thankfully these program forms #10784 have been standardized and are easily filed online at www.kofc.org.

1728 - Survey of Fraternal Activity –One way to help your brother Knights with this important requirement is for the Financial Secretary to keep a spreadsheet of Council projects and member hours through the calendar year. Individual project hours are sent to each member with their SFA Individual Member Worksheet to add to their other donated hours/activity. If your Council billing period is January to December, the worksheet can be included with annual Dues notices.

Meetings - Are all the Officers showing up and is there good member attendance? Are Council meetings interactive and interesting? The GK and Officers should be prepared and organized, keeping discussions relevant and on track. Show that you value your members' time, and they will attend and contribute. Waste a busy man's time and he'll go away. An hour is usually long enough.

Membership – Building and maintaining a successful Council takes dedication and a consistent team effort. The Officers should plan activities well in advance and communicate with the parish office to avoid scheduling conflicts. Council events should always be welcoming and have a recruiting dimension to them, with promotional materials available (brochures, K of C placemats for meals, etc.). Members should take a few minutes to visit with guests and thank them for attending. Many men say the reason they haven't joined is because no one asked them. Don't be afraid to ask. Every Council should have a ceremonial team that practices regularly and ready to bring in new members.

A healthy growing Council recognizes the efforts of individual members through the ***Knight of the Month*** award. The ***Family of the Month*** program recognizes families that are good Catholic role models and are generous with their time and talent in the parish or community. These applications are submitted to the Supreme Council by the Grand Knight.

Finally, remember that our parishioners are our charitable partners, so thank them through your parish bulletin or a Charitable Donations poster at your fundraising events. Your patrons need to know they're helping your Council make a difference locally.

Program Guide

Opening Greeting – The opening greeting should be done by the Grand Knight or his designee. The greeting should be brief and should cover three main topics: 1) Thank those in attendance for coming, 2) outline how the program will flow, and 3) Invite men in attendance who are not Knights to speak with you following the program to learn more about joining the Knights. Encourage everyone to really hear the names of the priests as they are read and commit to prayer for each of them individually and as a group.

Opening Hymn –If you are able to secure music for your program, an opening hymn is suggested. Allow the music ministry the freedom to make a selection or defer to your parish Priest.

Opening Prayer – With advance notice, invite your parish Priest or Deacon in attendance to offer an opening prayer.

Quiet Reflection – Allow those in attendance time to reflect on the opening prayer and prepare themselves for the hour. 5 minutes is recommended.

Contemplative Reading – Priest or Deacon

Rosary for Clergy –Prior to starting the program the knight responsible for coordinating this hour of prayer should ask 6 members of the council or parish family to take on a **leader** role. Each leader should read the text following the **Leader** prompt and then lead that section of the rosary. The first leader would read the text following **Leader** on “Rosary Page 1” and then lead those gathered in the Antiphon Beads.

Program Guide

Rosary for Clergy (continued) - The 2nd leader would read "We Pray for" followed by the names of the priests listed and then lead the 1st decade; and so on

Meditation with the Lord – Silent prayer and meditate. If you feel it's needed, the Grand Knight or his designee can read the meditation in the program to those gathered.

Supplement for Deacons and Seminarians – During silent meditation participants are encouraged to include Deacons and men in seminary in their prayers.

Closing Prayer – As the hour comes to a close, the Parish Priest or Deacon should end the program with a closing prayer.

Closing Hymn– If you are able to secure music, a closing hymn is suggested.

Notes of Guidance: Be sensitive in allowing your parish Priest to set the tone and make selections for this program but do not burden him with assignments and roles. This day is to benefit him, not a program he should feel he needs to run.

Finally, be present in the moment. While this hour is for our priests, every moment we spend with the Lord in prayer benefits us and is to be treasured.

*Pastores Dabo Vobis (I Will Give You Shepherds, 1992)*  
**CHAPTER II, HE HAS ANOINTED ME AND HAS SENT ME FORTH**  
**The Nature and Mission of the Ministerial Priesthood**  
**The Fundamental Relationship With Christ the Head and Shepherd**

15. *In their turn, the apostles, appointed by the Lord, progressively carried out their mission by calling - in various but complementary ways - other men as bishops, as priests and as deacons in order to fulfill the command of the risen Jesus who sent them forth to all people in every age. The writings of the New Testament are unanimous in stressing that it is the same Spirit of Christ who introduces these men chosen from among their brethren into the ministry Through the laying on of hands (cf. Acts 6:6; 1 Tm. 4:14; 5:22; 2 Tm. 1:6) which transmits the gift of the Spirit, they are called and empowered to continue the same ministry of reconciliation, of shepherding the flock of God and of teaching (cf. Acts 20:28; 1 Pt. 5:2). Therefore, priests are called to prolong the presence of Christ, the one high priest, embodying his way of life and making him visible in the midst of the flock entrusted to their care. We find this clearly and precisely stated in the first letter of Peter: "I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ as well as a partaker in the glory that is to be revealed. Tend the flock of God that is your charge, not by constraint but willingly, not for shameful gain but eagerly, not as domineering over those in your charge but being examples to the flock. And when the chief Shepherd is manifested you will obtain the unfading crown of glory" (1 Pt. 5:1-4). In the Church and on behalf of the Church, priests are a sacramental representation of Jesus Christ - the head and shepherd - authoritatively proclaiming his word, repeating his acts of forgiveness and his offer of salvation - particularly in baptism, penance and the Eucharist, showing his loving concern to the point of a total gift of self for the flock, which they gather into unity and lead to the Father through Christ and in the Spirit. In a word, priests exist and act in order to proclaim the Gospel to the world and to build up the Church in the name and person of Christ the head and shepherd.*

## **Candidate & Election Information for Pro-Life Voters**

November 5 is election day, but voting is already underway in Vermont! This election, the Vermont Right to Life Political Committee is not making candidate recommendations. Instead, we are encouraging voters to be aware of which candidates are supporting a pro-abortion agenda before they cast their ballot. Here are three resources to help you identify those candidates:

**Incumbent Legislators' support for pro-abortion S.37 (Act 15).** [S.37](#) is a pro-abortion bill passed by the Legislature and signed into law by Gov. Phil Scott. This law targets Vermont's 10 Pregnancy Resource Centers (PRCs) by giving the Attorney General (currently Charity Clarke, who made her views clear [here](#).) power to impose costly fines and penalties on the Centers for engaging in allegedly "deceptive" or "misleading" advertising. These provisions are being challenged as unconstitutional in Federal District Court. You can read more about the law and court case [here](#).

In addition, the law shields providers of abortion and transgender services from lawsuits originating out-of-state if the services were provided in Vermont (for example, a lawsuit from a New Hampshire parent whose minor daughter is brought to Vermont for an abortion by an abuser to circumvent that State's parental notification law and cover up the crime.) It also allows providers in Vermont to expand abortion services into other states via tele-health in violation of other states' laws.

**Planned Parenthood Endorsed Pro-Abortion Candidates.** Planned Parenthood Vermont Action Fund (PPVTAF) endorses 100% pro-abortion candidates who fill out their survey and promise to vote for their extreme agenda. **VPIRG Votes Endorsed Pro-Abortion Candidates.** VPIRG Votes, an arm of the Vermont Public Interest Research Group, endorses what they call "Pro-Choice, Pro-Climate, Pro-Democracy Candidates." Ballots can be returned by mail or dropped off in person at your Town/City Clerk's office before Election Day Nov. 5, or at your polling place by 7:00 pm on Election Day. If you mail your ballot, it must be **received** by 7:00 pm on Election Day, so allow 10 days for delivery. A postmark date is not sufficient.

If you did not receive a ballot, contact your Town/City Clerk. If you are not registered to vote, you can register up to and including Election Day and cast your ballot.

If you vote in-person, you are asked to bring the ballot you received in the mail with you to the polls. If you have misplaced or forget your ballot, you can get a new one at your polling place by signing a form.
