# STATE DEPUTY'S MESSAGE

Brother Vermont Knights,

I hope that you are enjoying a blessed Christmas Season and God bestows many graces on you and your families throughout the new year. Please pray for those who suffer from physical or mental illness, unemployment or the loss of a loved one around the holiday season. May our prayers and service to them demonstrate God's love and grant them healing, peace and eventual



joy! As we embark on 2025, I want to remind you that we desperately need to ramp-up our recruitment and council development efforts. As the largest lay ministry in Vermont, we must grow our councils if we are going to continue to be an effective and relevant arm of our Catholic Church and maximize service to those in need within our communities. The Supreme Council has set a very modest sustainment goal of 133 new members by June 2025, but we have only met 35% of that goal at the mid-year point. That means that, though we are doing great things and bringing in some new Knights, we are currently doing so at a rate that demonstrates that the Knights of Columbus in Vermont is continuing to decline in members and impact. It is sad for me to watch some councils close or gradually lose relevancy in parish life just because we haven't done everything we could to mobilize other Catholic men to join our team in faithful service to our Church and communities. As I have said before, when we grow, the faith grows and, in turn, so does the Church. This is a very serious mission, but we cannot achieve it unless we realize how important it truly is and follow Christ's calling to be "fishers of men" and invite our brother Catholics into active participation in the Order. This is NOT about filling "quotas." This is about bringing sincere and faithful Catholic gentlemen into our ministry who are ready to serve and to be the "Knights" that Blessed Michael McGivney envisioned us to be. We are ALL invested in this effort to grow in faith and participation. Our Church and community need us now more than ever. Please join me in answering this call to grow the Order and grow in service! Pray for our Vivat Jesus! Chris Poirier collective success and pray for the Catholic Church in Vermont.

# State Chaplain's Corner January, 2025

Dear Brothers and Families,

Blessed Christmas Season, and Feast of the Epiphany to you! I give you my abbreviated Christmas homily, and my prayers for the new year:



"The deepest and strangest and most revolutionary thought of this Christmastime is that we must worship the baby Jesus. Christ, as a child, shows all of the powerlessness of humanity. But God can enter the world as such a child, and exercises infinite might, overcoming our powerlessness for our salvation.

We are here to worship the Christ child. A merely sentimental approach to Christmas could give us a false sense of pride and power. Jesus seems to be so helpless as a baby, that any help given to him will surely carry a great reward. Christian charity is now an idea that is 2000 years old. It has become commonplace; that we might feel that if we extend some affection to the Christ-child then we are doing something "extra," as if we were the real helpers and Jesus is the one being helped. But even when Jesus was a little baby, helpless, in a way (a historical way but a fleeting way), we still are the ones being helped by Him! We were always the ones being helped!

Let us not think that we are "helping" Jesus that much; let us LOVE Him! Let us not think we are doing much that is "commendable," until we have fallen down at the manger to worship Jesus!... and confessed to him that we have nothing to offer.

What do you give as a birthday present to the child who made the universe? You have to give him an "eternal" gift! What do you have? An eternal heart and soul! This is what we must try to do as Christians. We must try to be the most faithful of Christians. Let's try to give him our heart and our soul.

Prayer Daily!!! Reconsider the Sacrament of confession. Prepare for the Eucharist. Worship the Christ-child in these sacraments throughout the New Year of 2025.

We have many valuable acts of contrition, acts of faith-hope-and-love, prayers of spiritual communion. I recommend them all. But I also say you can pray from the heart, in very simple words!

Pray with me. "Lord Jesus I believe you are the Son of God, and I trust you with my whole life, despite my own sins. From this day forward, make me holy and teach me to live with perfect love!"

# APPLICATION FOR SCHOLARSHIP IMPORTANT NOTICE TO APPLICANT

To qualify you must be a high school senior qualifying to graduate in June 2025 AND a son or daughter of a Knight of Columbus member (paternal or legally adopted) in good standing in a subordinate Council within the Vermont jurisdiction. Sons or daughters of deceased members are also eligible if their father was in good standing at the time of his death. An applicant may be a member of the Knights of Columbus or a member of a Columbian Squires Circle, in the jurisdiction of Vermont and a high school senior qualifying to graduate in June 2025.

Five \$1,000.00 scholarships will be given by the Vermont Knights of Columbus to assist recipients with their education at an accredited school or college of their choice.

Applications must be returned to the Chairman, at the address above, by March 7, 2025 to qualify for an award.

The application is in two parts with the major portion of Part II being completed by your school personnel. Therefore, we strongly suggest Part II be given to your school personnel <u>immediately</u> to allow the maximum time to prepare their part of the application.

The filing date should be brought to the attention of the guidance personnel of your school, since delinquent applications may disqualify an applicant from consideration for an award.

Failure to submit your essay may also result in the application being invalidated.

Scholarships not claimed by February 15, 2026 will be forfeited and the prize will be given to the next alternate on the list.

The Knights of Columbus stand in solidarity with our priests and religious. Through this program, council and parish families will raise funds to support seminarians in their area. For every \$500 given to an individual, the Supreme Council will refund the council or assembly \$100. The maximum refund a council or assembly can receive is \$400 per individual supported.

Though financial support is vitally important, it is not the only aspect of RSVP. Councils are also called to provide their "adopted" seminarian or religious aspirant with moral support and prayers for their success.

Providing such support is easy and can be accomplished through a variety of efforts: At the end of each council meeting or event, take a moment to remember the seminarian you support. # District Master Letter

As the Fourth Degree prepares to celebrate the 125th anniversary of its inception, plans are underway for its future in the Bishop Healy Province and throughout the entire Order. There is much work ahead, and success will require the combined efforts of all of us. To mark this significant occasion, special celebrations and exemplifications should be planned for every council and assembly.

One of the most important tasks the Order is currently working on is conducting a census of brother knights who served in Korea or Vietnam during the conflicts in those countries. Your active participation in this census is crucial. We need to accurately record the service history of our brothers who selflessly served their country so that they can be properly honored and remembered. They fulfilled their duty, and now it is our turn to ensure that their service is not forgotten. If you have not already surveyed your councils or assemblies, please do so as soon as possible and submit the results to me the District Master. This will ensure that our brothers from Vermont who served in these battle zones are included in the honors and remembrances that will take place next year. Each assembly and council is requested to survey members who may have served in either or both of these conflicts. Inclusion in the census is limited to veterans who meet the requirements established by Congress for the Korean and Vietnam Service Medals. These requirements are Korea: June 25, 1950 - July 27, 1953; Vietnam: July 3, 1965 - March 28, 1973. #### 6-point membership plan:

### 1. Plan to achieve STAR ASSEMBLY by planning and implementing the following criteria:

- Meet the Assembly's membership goal with a net gain of 6% additions over deletions.
- Complete and submit the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (#1728), which is due January 31, 2025.
- · Complete and submit to your District Master by April 30, 2025 the "To Be a Patriot Award" application.
- Earn the Civic Award by conducting a minimum of four patriotic programs during the 2017-2018 fraternal
  year and reporting those programs to the Supreme Master by June 30, 2025 on the "Civic Award"
  application.
- . Complete and submit the "Report of Officers Chosen for the Term" (#186). This form is due July 1, 2025
- 2. Attend the council planning meetings of each of the councils assigned to your assembly. At this meeting ask the Grand Knight and officers if the council has an event for the fraternal year that they would like a 4th Degree honor guard. This allows additional activity for the assembly, shows the councils Parish what the 4th degree does, and inspire membership for both the 3rd degree council, and the 4th degree assembly. Use this activity for membership opportunities for the upcoming exemplification in your area.
- 3. Complete the new planning guide for your four activities for the 2024-2025 fraternal year. You need to present the activities of the assembly to answer the first question of a potential member, "Why should I join the 4th degree"?
- 4. Sponsor a 3rd degree reception. At each kick off meeting we all will receive the 3rd degree schedule. I am asking the 4th degree assemblies that are hosting a 4th degree next year to sponsor the reception after each 3rd degree in their area. Have form 4's, and the assemblies completed program planning guide to inform the new 3rd degree candidates of how they would be active in the assembly. (distribute cookies)
- 5. Contact each GK of the councils assigned to your assembly. Ask for permission to make a presentation on the "ONE" upcoming exemplification at a council business meeting., bring regalia, wear your tux, have form 4's, discuss the upcoming exemplification in your area, share the planning guide for your assembly, have the information sheets on the degree that I produce, stay to answer questions. This should be done 2-4 months in advance of the exemplification in your area. Plan to attend the exemplification with as many candidates and Sir Knights from the assembly as possible.

- 6. Activate new 4th degree members through training. Within 60 days after the <u>ONE</u> exemplification in your area, plan a training session for all new members. I know that most of the assemblies' train on the fly when an honor guard is needed, that is not good enough. Here are what you should concentrate on prior to the new member being asked to join an honor guard.
  - a) Proper dress, use the drill manual (order copies and distribute to new members) to impress upon the members of the proper dress in an honor guard from shirt, socks, clean tux, to the proper pin.
  - b) Where to buy regalia, or if your assembly has extra equipment to share, distribute that equipment.
  - Color Corps protocol: Silent commands, Processions, recessionals, removal of berets at mass,
  - d) Manual of the Sword: How to draw, carry, and present the sword
  - e) Individual drill: General commands, hand salute, sword salute, berets salute, etc.
  - f) FRATERNATY: By conducting these training sessions, you activate members of the assembly to assist these new members, you activate the new members by making them a part of their new assembly, and giving them a purpose to belong.

If you wait until you're standing in a funeral home to train someone to stand guard at a brother Knights casket, you've waited too long, and the results will reflect the time you spent training that new member.

### Review the plan:

- Plan to achieve the STAR ASSEMBLY award
- Attend the council's planning meeting and offer to help with an honor guard at an appropriate council activity.
- Select & schedule four activities that your assembly wants to perform for the fraternal year 2024-2025 using the program planning guide.
- Order supplies (form 4's), make many copies of the planning guide
- · Sponsor a third-degree reception that include the councils your assembly is attached to.
- Make a presentation on the "ONE" Exemplification in your area at each of the councils that
  are assigned to your assembly at least 2-3 months in advance of the exemplification date.
- Plan for your assembly to attend the 4th degree exemplification in your area with as many candidates, and fellow sir knights as possible.
- · Train your new members

#### INTRODUCTION & OVERVIEW

Jubilee 2025 invites you to be a pilgrim of hope. For Christians, hope is anchored in the encounter with Jesus whose life, death, and resurrection reveals God's transforming love. Our hope in God is renewed constantly in the gift of the Holy Spirit, the love of the Father and the Son, who is given, even now, to the community of believers.

The Holy See has designated a number of Jubilee Days throughout 2025 to recognize and celebrate different groups of people and various ministries in the Church. The Jubilee of the Armed Forces, Police, and Security Personnel will be held from Saturday, February 8, to Sunday, February 9, 2025.

Recently, Pope Francis addressed participants in the 64th International Military Pilgrimage at the French Marian Shrine of Lourdes. Entrusting to God's mercy all of their comrades-in-arms who died serving their countries and defending peace, Pope Francis urged Catholic members of the military to let their faith inform their service:

"The world needs you, especially at PILGRIMS this dark moment in our history. We need men and women of faith who are capable of putting weapons at the service of peace and brotherhood."

The Pope also emphasized the need for quiet time for spiritual discernment that will allow military personnel to reaffirm with hope their vocation in prayer: "This spiritual pause at Lourdes is a time to rethink your military vocation from the perspective of faith, and of the love that every Christian must cultivate towards his brother, even his enemy."

In addition, Pope Francis urged members of the military to renew their commitment to the transformative Word of God: "Be military men and women who stand tall and proud to honor your uniform, your motto and your homeland, but who are also aware that you are part of a single human family, a family that is divided and wounded, but which Christ came to redeem and save through the power of love, not the violence

of arms." # New! - Sacred Heart of Jesus Pilgrim Icon

The Knights of Columbus have selected a painting of the Sacred Heart by Italian artist Pompeo Batoni, located in Rome's Church of the Gesù, to be the centerpiece of the new pilgrim icon program. Copies of the image, blessed by the papal almoner, will soon be given to each K of C jurisdiction and, beginning in 2025, will travel from council to council, serving as the focus for prayer services throughout the Order.

During their visit to Rome, Supreme Knight Kelly and other Supreme Officers gathered Oct. 23 at the Church of the Gesù for a votive Mass of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus celebrated by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William Lori. The 325-year-old side chapel in which they gathered was renamed the Chapel of the Sacred Heart in 1920 when Batoni's 1767 painting was placed above the altar. The Supreme Council has agreed to sponsor the restoration of the chapel, including Batoni's painting, in honor of the 350th anniversary celebration.



The new Sacred Heart of Jesus Pilgrim Icon is on its way to Vermont; having been shipped the week before Christmas. I have also been informed that prayer booklets, posters, and prayer cards will be shipped in mid-to-late January.
