Silver Rose - 2025


Join thousands of Catholics across North America in asking for Our Lady of Guadalupe's intercession through the Silver Rose program.

In 1960, the Columbian Squires, the Knights of Columbus' youth organization, came up with the idea of running a rose to the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey, Mexico, to honor Our Lady. The rose was chosen to commemorate Saint Juan Diego and the miracle of the roses.

Today, eight roses travel along different North American routes that include Canada, the United States and Mexico. Every stop the Silver Rose makes throughout the pilgrimage is a rosary-centered occasion to pray for respect for life, the spiritual renewal of each nation, and the advancement of the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe.



EVERYONE Needs a Plan for Long Term Care

It doesn't necessarily mean you need a policy, but the numbers indicate most of us will have to deal with this inevitability. The need for long term care continues to grow as our population ages. According to a study by the US Department of Health and Human Services, more than 70% of Americans over the age of 65 will need some form of long term care services during their remaining lifetime.

Fortunately, as a Knight you have access to our comprehensive LTC coverage. Knights of Columbus long term care insurance provides reimbursement for a variety of out of pocket expenses caused by an insured's inability to perform normal Activities of Daily Living (ADL's). An insured becomes benefit eligible if he/she has lost the ability to perform at least two of six defined ADL's or requires substantial supervision to protect the insured due to a severe cognitive impairment. It is designed to help Brother Knights and their families pay for skilled and custodial long term care services – whether at home or in an extended care facility.

Health insurance plans and government assistance programs generally do not provide sufficient coverage for long-term care needs. Depending on location, nursing home care can cost an average of \$83,000 per year, while at-home care can cost more than \$60,000 per year. Government programs, while helpful, are generally not intended to provide coverage for extended long term care events. Medicaid is the only program that does, and it requires the individual to spend down his or her assets, generally becoming impoverished before qualifying for benefits.


Special Event Lecture by James Bertrand on the Shroud of Turin

2321 – Civic Award Application

This form is due June 30th for the fraternal year, but don't let that fool you. They <u>are</u> reviewed at Supreme, so please submit it to the District Master (DM) early so he can review it. Worst case is you submit it in June and it gets rejected, and you don't have time to fix and resubmit it.

It is on the <u>Assembly forms page</u> at Supreme. You download a PDF version and rename/save it where you wish. When done, email it to <u>fraternalmission@kofc.org</u> and cc the DM.

This form is simple to fill out. You can submit it with additional sheets or photos if you wish, but that is not required. I have never submitted more than a sentence or two for each line. Be sure to complete the line at the top and the line at the bottom.

You need to list four items that one or more members of your Assembly have been involved in. The only requirements are that they be varied (so don't duplicate essentially the same thing) and patriotic, which has a pretty broad definition here.

Here are some guidelines. These fall into two categories that can overlap. Please ask me if you have a question about a specific event.

Patriotic programs/participation

Any sort of program your Assembly does that relates to US flags, troops, veterans, VA hospitals, first responders, Jr ROTC programs, patriotic rosaries, etc. counts. Examples:

- Posting flags at your church, businesses, neighborhoods, etc.
- Handing out flags to parishioners after Mass for some holiday.
- Supporting troops deploying or returning from deployment or in any other fashion.
- Supporting or participating in events at veterans' cemeteries.
- Recognizing veterans in your parish at Mass or some other event.
- Providing wheelchairs or any sort of support to a VA hospital or its patients.
- Recognizing or supporting local police or fire departments or other first responders.
- Recognizing JROTC programs or participants at a local high school.
- Hosting patriotic rosaries at a parish.

Fallouts

Most events where people fall out <u>in uniform</u> also qualify. These are not necessarily patriotic by the strictest definition, but they are part of what we do to make the Patriotic Degree of the order more visible, so they count too. Examples:

• Participating in any fallouts requested by the Bishop. In Austin the annual ones are the three ordinations (permanent diaconate, transitional diaconate, and priestly) and the Chrism Mass. There may be other occasional times such as installation of a Bishop.

- Participating in fallouts requested by a priest. This might be for certain Masses (e.g. Midnight Mass or a Holy Week Mass) or for confirmation, first communion, etc.
- Presenting colors at any public event banquet, sporting event, parade, meeting, etc.
- Marching in pro-life events like March for Life, various walks or hikes, etc.
- Falling out for funerals <u>might</u> qualify. Most Assemblies should have plenty of other activities to fill the four slots. See me before submitting a line for this.

There are not too many things we do that <u>don't</u> qualify, but some examples are:

- Fundraising events.
- Presenting colors at a non-public event such as an exemplification.
- Falling out for a private event such as a wedding, anniversary, quinceanera, etc.
- Supporting a seminarian, unless he belongs to the Archdiocese for the Military.

Make note of your most important or interesting program and that should become an entry for the To Be a Patriot award, which requires a bit more work. (See info <u>here</u>.)

Any Assembly that is active in programs and has people with the uniform who are active with fallouts should find this form easy to complete. My own Assembly started with only 32 people 15 years ago and we have received this award for the past 10-12 years.

TBP – To Be a Patriot Award Entry Form

This form is due to the District Master by April 15th for the fraternal year. (It says April 30th in the form but this has changed.) The DM reviews them and selects what he thinks is the best one to send to the Vice Supreme Master. The VSM does the same across his Province by May 15th and sends one to the Supreme Master by May 31st for consideration vs other Provinces.

It is on the <u>Assembly forms page</u> at Supreme. You download a PDF version of it and rename/save it where you wish. Don't let the 5/31 date fool you for the reasons above.

Completing this submission takes more effort than applying for the Civic Award. Typically you would choose from the program items you submitted on the Civic Award application. Follow the guidelines and fill in the form completely. Attach additional pages and photos if possible. It is similar to what Councils do when submitting entries for consideration for State awards.

Note that one of the lines on the forms is for the percentage of members participating. This is a key consideration when evaluating them. Some wonderful program that only one or two members worked on is less valued for this consideration than a program with a smaller impact that half the Assembly was involved in.

Best of luck to your Assembly if you submit an entry. This is a difficult award to win since it is awarded at the Supreme level, which makes it prestigious. It is <u>not</u> like the Civic Award, which is simple to complete and automatic assuming you complete the form correctly. Putting together this submission is a good way recognize your Assembly for some of the work they have done.






