



National POW/MIA Recognition Day was established in 1979 through a proclamation signed by President Jimmy Carter. Since then, each subsequent president has issued an annual proclamation commemorating the third Friday in September as National POW/MIA Recognition Day.

A national-level ceremony is held on every National POW/MIA Recognition Day. Traditionally held at the Pentagon, it features members from each branch of military service and participation from high-ranking officials.

Since 1999, the POW/MIA Accounting community has created a poster commemorating National POW/MIA Recognition Day. The annual edition of the poster continues to honor this tradition.



District Master Letter



Worthies All.

The District of Vermont ended the Fraternal Year at 75% of achieving our District quota. Another area of success was in our Patriotic and Civic Programs. The District of Vermont 2 eligible Star Assemblies. That is 10% of our District Assemblies, and a few of you were only a new member or two away from joining the eligible list. The district also had 4 Assemblies submit the Civic Award Application for achievement of four patriotic minded civic programs and

we had 3 Assemblies submitting the To Be A Patriot Award form for their best program. I would also like to point out the growing success of the district is evenly divided between the Diocese of Savannah and Archdiocese of Atlanta

Assemblies. This speaks volume to our statewide unified effort to serve.

On behalf of the District of Vermont Staff, our Worthy State Deputy, and our Vice Supreme Master, I want to thank you for your willingness to do more service.

The Glass Half Full?

Although 4 Civic Reporting Assemblies were great, that meant 16 did not submit the report. The question might be why not? Is it leadership or a lack of Fourth Degree knowledge? I am often asked by Assembly leaders if I can share Civic minded program ideas. Therefore, in an effort to get 100% Civic Award submissions, I am publishing the Patriotic and Civic minded programs in this newsletter. I ask each Navigator to review the list with your Assembly and see what four programs you can use this Fraternal Year. What is the Fourth Degree?

The Fourth Degree is a separate entity focused on Patriotism and Citizenship. The Fourth Degree has a separate chain of command. Each District takes its Fraternal Year marching orders from the Supreme Master, Vice Supreme Master, and District Masters. As leaders, we are governed by the Supreme Board of Directors.

The Fourth Degree is "A part of, not apart from" the Membership Degree.

The Fourth Degree is the highest degree of the Order. When the Georgia

Fourth Degree's mission of Patriotism and Citizenship programs are added to
the Membership Councils' mission programs, it makes the Vermont Knights of
Columbus whole, "One in Charity, One in Unity, One in Fraternity, and One in
Patriotism".

The Fourth Degree Assembly is not an extension of the Council, but we should work to make our Councils stronger. Fourth Degree Sir Knights are council leaders, and workers in many council programs. Sir Knights know to answer the call to serve.

I'm asking each Assembly leader to work with the councils whom you serve, and find ways to assist in recruiting good Catholic males into our Order.

Always remember, you can't be a Sir Knight until you first become a Brother Knight. Future Assembly and Council great leaders are out there, just waiting to be asked to join.

In closing, our Supreme Master has tasked Districts to have 100% Star

Assemblies. This Fraternal Year, I challenge each Assembly to these six steps;

- Consider having a Fourth Degree Uniform Assistance Program.

Please be sure to send only completed packets (Form 4, Dinner Reservation for guests, and check made payable to the Master at least 10 days prior to the Exemplification Date). INCOMPLETE PACKETS OR PACKETS NOT HAVING ALL THE INFORMATION WILL BE RETURNED TO THE FAITHFUL NAVIGATOR.

Please note that Candidates should be reminded to have their current 3rd Degree Membership Card with them at the time of registration.

assemblies that have gone above and beyond to achieve recognition through the Star Assembly and Supreme Civic Awards. These accomplishments are a reflection of your dedication and teamwork.

As we move forward, let us remain steadfast in our mission to serve both God and country. I encourage each of you to continue recruiting new members, mentoring future leaders, and participating in our patriotic exemplifications. His previous three years have been very successful, and a lot has been accomplished. Master David Ely Sr. has made some changes concerning the district marshals. We can be called upon to assist your Color Corps commander with training. I have noticed a definite growth in the number of Color Corps members, particularly in the district of Vermont, and keep up the good work. It is the job of the Faithful Navigator to encourage and grow his assembly Color Corps. An assembly never wants to deny a Color Corps request due to no Color Corps being available, or to look bad with a very small number of Color Corps showing up. A number of assemblies are encouraging members to join their Color Corps by providing financial assistance to help pay for the fourth degree uniform. Some councils, often the beneficiary of the Color Corps, are also offering to contribute financially to a member joining the Color Corps. Financial assistance may entice a member to join the Color Corps, but that member must be joining out of a desire to serve. To serve by his commitment to training, and by being at call-outs, even though it is not convenient. Your service is paid back many folds by the gratitude family members express for your presence at their loved one's wake and funeral. It is paid back in the pride you feel by participating in our religious and patriotic activities. There is also the sense of brotherhood felt among your fellow Color Corps members. Each assembly should continue their efforts to "grow the corps" and not settle for combining their Color Corps as the answer to "grow the corps." Each assembly must take pride in their Color Corps numbers and performance.

Role of the District Marshal

A District Marshal in the Knights of Columbus Fourth Degree is responsible for overseeing assemblies within a district, coordinating ceremonial activities, and providing guidance and support to Regional Marshals and local Color Corps members. They are instrumental in planning patriotic events, facilitating the Exemplifications of the
